Internationally acclaimed as one of the most passionate and articulate critics of globalization, Dr. Vandana Shiva is a physicist, philosopher of science and an indefatigable activist. In 1982, Dr. Shiva left her job as scientific researcher at the Indian Institute of Management to found the Research Foundation for Science, Technology and Natural Resource Policy where she now serves as director. In 1991 she founded Navdanya, a national movement to protect the diversity and integrity of living resources, especially native seeds. In 1993 she was awarded the Right Livelihood Award for her pioneering insights into the social and environmental costs of the dominant development model, and her ability to work with local communities in the articulation and implementation of alternatives. Dr. Shiva is also Science and Environment advisor to the Third World Network and the Asia Pacific People's Network, and associate editor of *The Ecologist*. She was also named one of the top five most powerful people in Asia by *Asia Week* magazine. Dr. Shiva's books include *Water Wars*; *Monoculture of the Mind: Biotechnology and the Environment*; *Stolen Harvest: The Hijacking of the Global Food Supply*; and *Biopiracy: the Plunder of Nature and Knowledge*. Dubbed the “Trade Debate’s Guerrilla Warrior” by the *National Journal*, Lori Wallach is the director of Public Citizen’s Global Trade Watch, founded by Ralph Nader in 1971. Wallach is a leading advocate for fair trade and investment policy and she has represented Global Trade Watch in promoting the public interest regarding globalization and international commercial agreements in many fora such as the U.S. Congress, the courts, government agencies, and the media. A graduate of Wellesley College and Harvard Law School, Wallach is a former Capitol Hill television news reporter and an election campaign veteran who has testified before more than 30 congressional committees about NAFTA, GATT and other trade proposals. Wallach, who has authored numerous trade analyses, newspaper editorials, and *Whose Trade Organization?: Corporate Globalization and the Erosion of Democracy*, is a founding board member of the IFG. ▲
